

Mission 1: Look for the hidden ingredients in Vilanova! Where will you find them?

The basic ingredients of Vilanova's seafaring cuisine are the vegetables of the local orchards and, as the main ingredient, top quality fish.

Vilanova's dishes are dominated by simplicity, common sense and the cook's experience.

El Far de Vilanova (The Vilanova's Lighthouse)
- Here you will find:

The San Cristóbal lighthouse is popularly known as the Vilanova lighthouse. The first maritime signal was inaugurated in 1834. It has been enlarged several times, the last one in 1905. Since then it has always been in operation and has only been switched off once, in 1939 during the Civil War.

The Vilanova Lighthouse holds the Museum of the Sea, which aims to highlight the value of the maritime heritage.

Visit the Espai Far (Lighthouse Space) and immerse yourself in the seafaring history of Vilanova



Mercat de Mar (Sea market)
- Here you will find:

It was inaugurated in 1982, in one of the most charismatic enclaves of the city's maritime quarter. More than 40 professionals offer fresh products from the orchard and the sea.


Stroll through the sea market, enjoy a market full of life, parades and fresh produce. The best freshly caught fish.



The fish market of Vilanova) - Here you will find:

The fish market is the place in the fishing port where the auction of the catches is carried out. The traditional way of auctioning was by voice, where the buyers stood around the boxes, and the auctioneer set the price. The auction was downward, i.e. it started with a certain amount and went down in price until one of the buyers, with a shout, stopped it, meaning that he would buy that box. Nowadays the system is automated and the process is done with computers and technology.

Stroll through the port and immerse yourself in the smell of one of the most important fishing ports in Catalonia!





The sea mill (Moli de Mar) - Here you will find:

At the beginning of the 19th century, the sea mill was created, which was intended to be able to use the force of the waves to drive a system of pumps to make the sea water rise in an upper basin; when the water was drained by gravity, it would turn a millstone to be able to grind flour. The benign conditions of our sea, however, did not allow for a sufficiently regular wave cycle to give continuity to a project that was intended to take advantage of natural resources and become, in today's terms, a sustainable source of energy...

Discover the vestiges of a work at the cutting edge of its time!





Posit Vell (Old fishing Coop) - Here you will find:

Former social club and warehouse of the Cofradía de Pescadores (Fishermen's Guild). It was built in 1898. It is a building with a large window opening onto the Paseo Marítimo, which fits in harmoniously with the old fishermen's houses. The ground floor was used for repairing the nets, while the first floor was used for social activities. The decoration of the façade, with ceramic details, gives it a modernist touch.



Posit Nou (New fishing Coop) - Here you will find:

The new finish cooperative was inaugurated on Saint Peter's Day 1925. It was a clear example of labour, community and cooperative organization. It offered its participants mutual aid in the event of an accident at work that prevented them from carrying out their work. It created spaces for fishermen to meet and had a special concern for culture.
